## Silent Warriors at the Front

As rough as patrols were during the Korean War, the 26th Infantry Scout Dog Platoon made the patrol's dangers more bearable. The platoon provided an unbroken record of reliable service for countless ambush patrols mounted by the American divisions during the last two years of the war.

It was on a bare hilltop called “Kelly” in the middle of the main line of resistance, where I became familiar with the special skills of scout dogs. Prior to my arrival in the summer of 1952, the 65th Puerto Rican Regiment had suffered many casualties from patrolling activities in “No-Man’s Land”.

In August 1952 in an attempt to mitigate the losses, the regiment received the services of a 125 lb. German Shepherd dog and handler who were assigned to A Co., the unit designated for conducting the regimental patrols for the month.

I was designated as patrol leader since the only other officer present for duty was the acting CO who didn't need any

additional valuable combat experience. For me, it would be my first ambush patrol and I was simply glad for any assistance—man or beast.

The introduction of the 26th in direct support of combat troops in Korea was initiated in June 1951, German Shepherds were used by the platoon because they possessed the necessary temperament,

# Active Duty Liaison

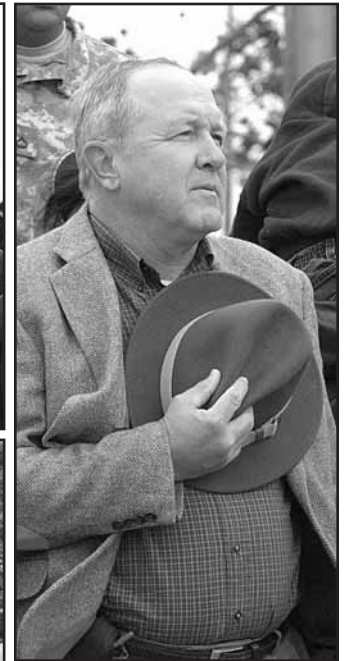

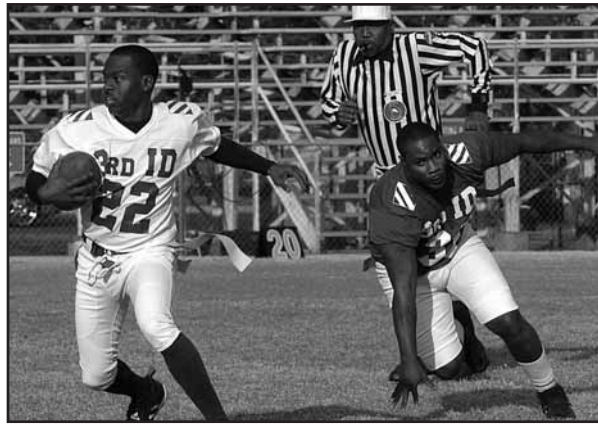
## Marne Week

### Back to Iraq!

As many of you have read and heard, the events in Iraq are requiring the return of the Division to its third tour of Duty with Operation Iraqi Freedom. Over the summer, 1st BCT Brigade under the command of Col. Charlton has been busy preparing for the return with training exercises and family support activities. The 1st BCT Brigade consists of the following units: 2-7 IN, 3-69 AR, 5-7 Cav, 1-41 FA, 1-3 BSTB, and 3 BSB BN. The Brigade's advance party, consisting of 145 soldiers, left the week of Jan 8th with the rest of the Brigade to soon follow. Other Brigades and Units of the Marne Division will be rotating to Iraq by early summer.

Even though the Division is returning to Iraq, it has always had a presence in OIF with soldiers from the 385th MP Bn deployed overseas in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. The Unit returned to Ft. Stewart in November 2006 minus one soldier who completed her tour of Duty earlier than expected.

### Warriors Walk Dedication

After a stormy October night in Georgia, the next morning presented us with a bright sunny day for the Division and its supporters to take a few moments out of their day to recognize another fallen soldier with an Eastern Red Bud tree and granite stone on Warriors Walk. 1LT Ashley (Henderson) Huff of the 549th MP Co.-385th MP Bn had been in Iraq working to train that country's police force when she was killed Sept. 19 by a suicide bomber bomb-laden car exploded near her patrol.

Ashley was a newlywed and left behind her husband of one year, Brian Huff.

Let's hope and pray that over the next year that we do not have to dedicate any Eastern Red Buds along Warriors Walk. But, in reality, we are heading back to a combat zone and we realize and understand that casualties are a result of war and when another tree is planted, the Society will be there to honor the memory of a fellow Marne Soldier.

recognizes the service and sacrifice of the American Soldier at home and around the world, at war and during peace.

The Registry of the American Soldier provides an opportunity for anyone who served in the U.S. Army to have his or her name and service history placed on record at the Museum. If you served, you need to be in the Registry!

You may also register the name of a family member or friend, if they currently serve, or have served in the U.S. Army, or submit someone from the past.

The Registry will be on permanent display at the Museum, and it will be accessible via the internet for those who cannot visit in person.

The Registry of the American Soldier is a publicly submitted listing of those who served in the U.S. Army. The Registry is not an official document of the U.S. Government.

### FAQ's

*What is the Registry of the American Soldier*

- Electronic database of those who served their country in the U.S. Army
- Accessible at the Museum or online via the Foundation website
- Free – no contribution required
- Special recognition for those who gave their lives
- Includes name\*, rank\*, hometown\*, dates of service (\* required information)

### Why was the Registry developed?

- To fulfill the mission of the National Museum of the U.S. Army that the face of the Army reflects the face of America

• To capture the history of Soldiers' service to America, at home and abroad, so that future generations will not forget

• To commemorate the sacrifice of those who served and those who gave their lives in service to America

### Eligibility

Those who served honorably in uniform in one or more of the following components may be entered in the Registry.

- Active Army
- Army Reserve
- Army National Guard
- Army Air Corps (Army Air Forces)
- WAC / WAAC
- Honorable (or Medical, or General) Discharge
- Eligibility dates: 1775 to present

The Registry of the American Soldier is coming along very well! On 31 August 2006 we had 25,500 Army Veterans registered and on 31 December 2006 we had 37,405 registered. To register, go to [www.armyhistory.org](http://www.armyhistory.org) or call 1-800-506-2672.

In late spring, kits will be available to help volunteers get the word out about this museum in their respective areas. size, and ruggedness required to withstand the rigors of combat and in all climates. This one platoon with approximately 24 scout dogs had to fulfill the requests from all the American divisions on the line. Therefore, the scout dogs and their handlers pulled patrols every night which made them eligible for rotation back to the states after nine months. Both handler and scout dog returned stateside together. They were truly inseparable.

These magnificent dogs were able to detect hidden enemy far in advance of patrol's ability to see, hear or smell the enemy, Kimchi notwithstanding. In general, a scout dog would alert to the presence of enemy soldiers much like a bird dog's rigid stance but with its head high, tail straight back, and ears erect.

My copy of the patrol plan laid out the route and position for the two reinforced squads; they were to be escorted by a Cpl. Murphy and his scout dog 'King'. As evening drew on and before last light, we made preparations to go over the top and down the well traveled, communication wire laden trail to the flat bottom of "No-Man's Land". There was no moon. In single file, we crept along the front line to our departure point. "King" was up first, clearing the trench's wooden box steps and low barbed wire entanglements as clean as a thoroughbred jumper. In the dimming light, his long cloth leash fluttered in the summer breeze. We relied on King's night vision and keen hearing to get us safely down the steep path.

Because of King's special scout training enabled him to concentrate on his job, he was not distracted by the cacophony of

sound coming from the horrific firefight on "Old Baldy", a hilltop in the 2nd Infantry Division's sector. We could clearly see the Chinese soldiers advancing upright towards the division's trenches. The searchlights illuminated completely the barren dirt hilltop. The out going artillery shells landed squarely on the Chinese soldiers who simply evaporated into the night's sky.

The night was still and warm. The battle sounds from "Old Baldy" had ceased. The searchlights were turned off. Only the occasional artillery flare broke the black darkness. There was the sound of incoming mortar rounds but they landed up and over on the front trenches. We passed the remained of the new day in complete silence and in wet fatigues. King was lying down and completely hidden in the tall grass but he kept looking straight ahead in the direction of the enemy's front. He saw nothing and heard nothing.

At 0430 hours we were given the order to return. I informed Cpl. Murphy to let King take us back. We crept our way back into the regiment's lines and gratefully gulped down a Puerto Rican hot beverage concoction—a blend of the "C" ration's cocoa powder and instant coffee. Our escorts headed back to their platoon, the patrol members crashed in their sand bag bunkers and I reported to my CO. The patrol was 100 percent successful. We came back without a scratch thanks to our skillful escorts.

These patrols would be repeated 23 more times during the month. King and Cpl. Murphy had lessened the dangers and tricky tasks of ambush patrols for the reg-

iment. The patrols were without casualties which was balanced against a few deaths when a group of soldiers bunched up together waiting for the arrival of King. The Chinese fired three quick artillery rounds into the group killing two instantly and wounding several others. Our artillery could not return fire. Their fire was restricted to night time firing.

This then was but one part of the story, the other had to do with General Maxwell Taylor, Commander of the 8th Army. In January 1953 at 8th Army's Headquarters in Seoul, Sgt. Murphy and King gave the general and his staff officers a demonstration of a scout dog's patrol movements. The large group of officers was seated in a small auditorium. They watched in amazement as Sgt. Murphy, using hand signals put King through his paces. King executed the intricate movement flawlessly. Each completed maneuver was greeted with a thunderous applause.

The general was deeply moved by King's performance. He could see the value of incorporating a scout dog platoon in each infantry division. General Taylor recommended to the Pentagon for the activation of five additional scout dog platoons for the American divisions. But the deadlock peace talks were broken at Panmunjon and with an armistice agreement near the request was dropped.

As a result of the outstanding service rendered by these silent warriors, they will always be recognized and remembered by the soldiers whom they guided through the rigors and dangers of combat. To their memory, we extend a grateful thank you for a job well done.

**Editor's Note:** In the cover letter with this article, the author closed his letter with these words, "As a result of this unique combat experience, I became a veterinarian after leaving active service in June 1954." Therefore, the initials after his name in his letter were V.M.D. There is an organization of Dog Handlers like the Society. An active member of this organization lives in my area. He was a dog handler in Vietnam. Unlike the dogs that served so valiantly in Korea, those that served in Vietnam were NOT sent home. They were all put to sleep. About 3,000 dogs served honorably in Vietnam.

helped us to get the Infantry to paddle faster so we could land where we were supposed to. Then during our retreat to get off the island, mortar rounds sort of walked us back to the river before we could get back to the boats. Short mortar rounds—maybe?? (Note, I was FO for the 4.2 Mortars that day, and the prior day called fire from the bow gunners seat of that stuck tank. —Terry)

My health isn't the best. I guess when you turn 80 years young, the curve seems to be going the other way. The first hundred is the toughest as my brother who I just lost would say.

I'm still working to get the memorial for the Disabled Veterans built. It's going to be dedicated in the 2010. The design is already made with a star in the middle and eternal flame. It will be close to the Pentagon—so all the Congressmen will see it daily. Probably help them to make up their minds when they vote before sending our troops off to war.

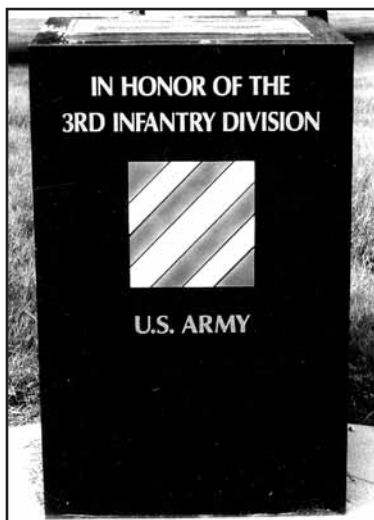
### Southern California

To honor the Third Infantry Division War Dead and to perpetuate the memory of other former comrades who shared a background of honorable military service with the Third Infantry Division, Outpost 22 will dedicate another monument in a national cemetery. All society members are welcome to attend the dedication.

The impressive monument is of highly polished black granite four feet tall, two and one half feet wide, two feet in depth and is placed on a raised foundation. The division patch is prominently etched on the front of the monument. Surmounted in the top of the monument with a three-inch slope is a bronze plaque measuring two feet by one foot. The plaque denotes all the campaigns fought by the division during the First World War, the Second World War, the Korean War, the Gulf War and Operation Iraqi Freedom. The number of Medals of Honor awarded to division soldiers during each war is also included.

The monument has been installed at the Riverside National Cemetery and the dedication is tentatively planned for mid January. We will notify all outposts as soon as the date of dedication is confirmed.

This is the third monument that Outpost 22 has installed in a Southern California national cemetery. Previously dedicated monuments are at the Los Angeles National Cemetery and the Fort Rosecrans National Cemetery, San Diego. The outpost has embarked on planning for the installation

of a fourth monument. That monument will installed be at the newly designated cemetery in Miramar with a tentative date of 2009.

The Museum is being built on 89,400 square meters just outside the gates of Fort Benning, the home of the infantry and one of the U. S. Army's largest training posts. The Korea War Gallery is to honor the U.S. soldiers who fought for South Korea's liberty and sacrificed their lives to build a stronger friendship between our two countries. The South Korean government has promised to donate \$500,000 via its consul general in Atlanta, and the Samsung Group, South Korea's foremost conglomerate, pledged \$1 million for the construction of the Gallery at the Infantry Museum.

### **Marne Trail Update**

In December Mr Gérard Fabre, Mayor of Garéoult, contacted Outpost Member Andre Watrinet, a citizen of Garéoult, telling him that on August 18th, 2007 the town plans to install its tablet in commemoration of its liberation in August 1944 by the 3rd Infantry Division. The Mayor and the City Council have invited Monika and Tim to participate in the ceremony. Additionally Mr Masseurille of La Roquebrussane (approx. 5 miles West of Garéoult) has forwarded to us the Mayor and Council's invitation to their ceremony to be held the same day! To top it all, the town of Rocbaron (approx. 5 miles east of Garéoult) will also install its tablet on the same day. The three communities are holding a meeting to coordinate their ceremonies so that citizens and guests may attend all three events without having to speed between them. Both Andre and Henri Galea, our regional Chairman, are on top of the coordination of these events on behalf of the Outpost.

We are expecting details on several more ceremonies to be held in the second half of August in Southern France to become available in the near future. Among communities that have indicated interest were Cavallaire, which would emplace a plaque on 15 August. 24 August should see the dedication of a plaque in Cavaillon. As you may remember from our earlier reports, that community has held its liberation ceremony every year and even without Americans present they always played our national anthem during the ceremony. Orange has also indicated it would dedicate a tablet, with its ceremony being held on 26 August. We expect several more communities to contact us soon. It is also possible that some may choose to hold their ceremonies on V-E Day, 8 May.

There are also communities in Alsace planning to follow Kunheim's lead of this past May. Their ceremonies would fall either on 8 May or in the November 2007 to February 2008 time-

frame. We have yet to receive positive responses from communities in the Vosges, but any ceremonies would be most likely in October and November. Communities liberated in the Franche-Comte would most likely hold their ceremonies in September.

Important to remember is that most of the communities liberated in Southern France will celebrate that fact on the appropriate day. Not all will be dedicating tablets this year, and communities that dedicated tablets last year will most likely still be holding ceremonies. We expect to have a very busy second half of August again this year! Please remember that all of the communities that joined the Marne Trail last August have expressed the great desire to see our veterans, so if you can come, let us know and we can get in touch with your French friends!

Our move to Northern Virginia has led to a short break in correspondence with the communities in Southern France as it appears the German post office has not been forwarding our mail. We hope to rectify this situation soon so that we can continue working with all of the communities in Provence to appropriately recognize the Marne Division and mark the Marne Trail. We hope to have much more detail for you in the next issue of the Watch.

## Call for Nominations

This is the Society's call for nominations. # Walter Reed's World of Hurt, Hope

## Suffering of Iraq Casualties Takes Toll on Hospital Staff

Solomon Montgomery wakes up early on workdays. Hours before dawn, the first thing he does is pray.

He prays for the soldiers he will try to help that day, whose bodies were ravaged during attacks in Iraq. He prays that their families find comfort and courage. And with no end to the bloodshed in sight, he asks God for support. "Lord," he says, "give me the strength to do my job."

At 7 a.m., he reports for duty at Walter Reed Army Medical Center. The war remains ubiquitous in the operating rooms, some of which are set aside for the returning wounded, and on the wards, where amputees begin coming to terms with their new realities. Montgomery, a physical therapy assistant with the bulk of a former defensive end, works in a ball- and mat-filled space where, hour after hour, he challenges and cheers on brain-injured soldiers not much older than his own teenager.

So many have arrived in the past three years — so many continue to arrive — that they have transformed the hospital's routine. The staff has been redeployed, programs created, a special military company activated just for the injured. "This has become our normal," a nurse explains. But the cumulative effect of nearly 4,900 patients, including 1,458 battle casualties, has done more than change the institution. It has deeply affected the hundreds of doctors, nurses and therapists who work there — who have been inspired by the resiliency and motivation of the individuals in their care, yet shaken and exhausted by the magnitude of loss.

Since the first soldier was admitted March 28, 2003, nine days after the invasion of Iraq, Walter Reed has confronted damage of daunting proportion: limbs blown off, guts blown open, brains devastated by piercing shrapnel or by concussive explosions, or maybe all that and more. The youth of the wounded elicits sadness, even

tears. The veteran staff members look at these patients and see their sons and daughters. Their younger counterparts see siblings, friends.

"That's always my worst nightmare, that I'm going to take care of someone I know," says Capt. Matthew Hueman, a 31-year-old surgical resident whose West Point class has suffered casualties in the war.

Six thousand miles from the actual mortar fire, grenades and roadside bombs, it amounts to a different kind of combat fatigue.

At the start, they expected that the transports of casualties would taper off quickly. But three times a week, the white buses from Andrews Air Force Base still turn off Georgia Avenue NW through the hospital's main gate. They pull slowly up the looping drive to where a double line of gurneys and a small company of gown-clad escorts wait, and then each bus's back door swings open, revealing the litters of patients. Some soldiers are only 48 hours off the battlefield. The most critically injured are unloaded with so much medical equipment they are scarcely visible beneath it.

A pause to lower a litter, convey charts and untangle tubes, and then the new arrival is whisked inside, under the Walter Reed banner proclaiming "We provide warrior care" and on to a triage room.

That pause is all Michael Wagner needs to say, "Welcome home."

Over the past 2 1/2 years, the chief of the hospital's Medical Family Assistance Center estimates that he has greeted hundreds of patients, as well as thousands of family members. His first weeks, he struggled to find the right words. "This guy's missing a leg. What do I say to him?" he wondered. Until he understood: "They're not legs, they're not arms. They're human beings."

These days, the psychologist talks to spouses and parents with a gentle bluntness.

"How you doing?" he asks.

"Fine," they invariably say.

"How you doing?" he asks a second time.

"Fine," they repeat.

"Baloney," he says.

At which point family members usually cry. "You have to permit them to feel their hurt," he says.

Wagner, 56, is a retired Army colonel who joined up during the Vietnam War. After the 2001 terrorist attacks, he tried to volunteer anew, ultimately connecting with the command at Walter Reed and moving from Arizona to run interference for soldiers' families. At the assistance center — established in response to the casualties' protracted presence — he has been asked to secure everything from a massage to mortgage money. When all guest accommodations on post are filled, he persuades local hotels to provide rooms at no charge. "I need you to be a good American here," he tells hotel managers.

Still, 12-hour days consumed with strangers' needs are draining. Last fall, he finally realized how tired he was, "tired of seeing the wounded come in, young men and women in the prime of their lives, coming back ripped apart. . . . It was overload, burnout, whatever you want to call it."

The stress, he says, "wears on everybody in this hospital."

Wagner has learned how to take time off, how to get on his Harley and ride out of the city, into rural stretches of Maryland. He's reached a different place, not necessarily numb to the pain around him but able to put it in a broader context. "This is our normal," he says. "Our mission."

When he leaves the hospital grounds, which will receive soldiers until Walter Reed moves to Bethesda in several years, he finds himself looking for people with missing limbs. Their absence seems strange.

Her parents back in Washington state worry, but they don't press her for details. "How's life on the ward?" her mother will say, vaguely enough.

"We've got some complicated guys on the floor right now," Clarisa Nichols answers. She does not elaborate.

She is 24, and the hospital is her first duty station out of nursing school. She is assigned to Ward 57, the busy orthopedics unit once populated by older men and women recuperating from knee surgeries or hip replacements. In more than two years,

1st Lt. Nichols has seen virtually no such patients.

What she has seen are soldiers around her age, with massive pin-and-bolt armatures securing fractured bones or thick dressings covering raw stumps. They may be brought onto the floor with desert sand in their hair or spilling from their gear, and suddenly Iraq seems even closer. Nichols could be sent with scant notice to a combat support hospital there. Overseas duty is a matter of when, not if.

She will be ready. Her responsibilities at Walter Reed have made sure of that. At first, she questioned whether she would be able to handle them — not so much emotionally as technically. Would she have the skills to do the job? She found herself tested on both fronts, staggered initially by the influx of casualties and challenged by their worst injuries.

“Sometimes,” she says, “I’ll go back to our break room and take a couple deep breaths. I’ll think, ‘Is there anything else I can possibly do?’”

Sometimes there is not. No more medicine she can offer, no relief other than a repositioned pillow or appendage. A patient Nichols will never forget, a soldier from the foreign forces assisting the United States in the fighting, writhed for hours one night. He spoke no English and would look at her uncomprehendingly. “There was no way I could reassure him,” she says. “It was just one of those times; I sat down and held his hand. I felt helpless.”

She balances that memory with the moments when patients took their beginning steps on a new prosthesis or returned with a smile and big hug after discharge. The nurses keep a bound book listing all the patients on the unit from December 2003, and on a slower shift, they’ll get nostalgic looking through the pages. All told, the hospital has treated 323 amputees from Iraq and Afghanistan.

It also has seen the deaths of 11 service members.

“I can’t believe how long it’s been happening,” Nichols reflects one afternoon. She has a younger brother in the Navy and a younger sister in the Army. “It’s still hard to see an 18-year-old come in. Every so often, you wonder when it’s going to end.”

the more than 520 in each of the previous years. The trauma that sent them there — frequently so extensive that the military coined the term “polytrauma” — did not diminish.

Few wounds now hold the same shock factor for the hospital’s surgeons. Col. Craig Shriver, who heads the general surgery department, remembers the teams of residents who came to him in late 2003 after their overnight rotations in the OR. “Three months is enough,” they told him.

Recent teams have reacted far differently, though their chief doubts they are any tougher. More likely, after hearing and reading accounts of the injuries, they simply have been better fortified. “Maybe they’ve come to expect it,” he says. As they are deployed, these new doctors will take their training directly to the troops.

Shriver himself has more than two decades in the Army and two tours as a combat surgeon. At 47, he could retire tomorrow. The reason he stays: As long as the conflict drags on, and the buses from Andrews return with their damaged cargo, he feels an obligation “to finish the job.”

The last several years at Walter Reed have been the most demanding of his career. They’ve also been among the most humbling and rewarding. He marvels at the soldiers’ attitude, their gratitude, their perseverance.

“What this has taught me is, our youngest generation is magnificent,” he says.

It has renewed his faith in America.

By 10:40 in the morning, Solomon Montgomery is halfway through a set of balance exercises with 20-year-old Pfc. Daniel Perry of Somers, Conn.

“Move the top of your body,” he says. “Give it a good stretch.”

Bluish traces of shrapnel dot the left half of the soldier’s pale face, betraying the blast

that left him unconscious in an Iraqi bunker 27 days earlier. Perry met Montgomery when he was barely able to stand, unable to walk, incapable of following all but the simplest commands and angry and confused. He tried to kick the big guy, more than twice his size and age.

“Looks like this boy is going to be fun to work with,” Montgomery responded cheerfully.

His PT unit focuses on those with traumatic brain injury. Before the war, it didn’t exist. No need for it.

“I didn’t realize what I was getting into,” concedes Montgomery, a civilian employee who came to Walter Reed in 2000. During their time together, he has watched Perry make steady progress. Other patients have not. Two years ago, he was assigned a brain-injured soldier in his early twenties, a father of three whose youngest child had just been born. The man could neither hold nor see his baby: He had lost both arms and his eyesight.

Montgomery drove home that afternoon and went to bed. He stayed home the next day. He couldn’t go to work; he couldn’t even get out of bed. The tragedy seemed too overwhelming.

He has since found deeper reservoirs of strength — his church in Brandywine, his Bible study group, his high school daughter, who senses when to ask, “Daddy, is the war bothering you again?” The war has brought them closer. The war, in fact, “has helped me grow to be a better man.”

He pauses. There is more.

“It’s made me realize how precious life is,” he says, “and the price you pay for freedom.”

## Flag Etiquette

When a president of the United States dies, how long should the American flag at half-staff?

For the recent death of former President Gerald Ford, who died December 26, 2006, the period ended January 25th.

The code also states that the flag shall be flown at half-staff 10 days from the day of death of the vice president, the chief justice or a retired U.S. chief justice, or the speaker of the House of Representatives.

It is to fly at half-staff from the day of death until the burial of an associate justice of the Supreme Court, a secretary of an executive or military department, a former vice president or the governor of a state.

The flag should fly at half-staff on the day of death and the following day for a member of Congress.

It should be noted that while the code is the clear authority for flag display and is followed by most federal and state institutions, it generally is not legally binding to individual flag owners or businesses.

# Marne Division Distinctions

**The 3rd Division is the only U.S. Army Division which fought the Axis on all European fronts.**

**8 Nov 42:** The Division first saw action in the invasion of North Africa, landing at Fedala and capturing half of French Morocco.

**10 Jul 43:** The Division made an assault landing on Sicily, fought its way into Palermo before the armor could get there, and raced to capture Messina, ending the Sicilian campaign.

**18 Sep 43:** The Division landed at Salerno, 9 days after the invasion of Italy. It drove across the Volturno to Cassino.

**22 Jan 44:** After a brief rest, the Division was ordered to hit the beaches at Anzio where for four months it maintained its toe-hold against furious German counterattacks.

**29 Feb 44:** The Division fought off an attack by three German Divisions. In May the Division broke out of the beachhead and drove on to Rome, and then went into training for the invasion of Southern France.

**15 Aug 44:** The Division landed at St. Tropez, advanced up the Rhone Valley, through the Vosges Mountains, and reached the Rhine at Strasbourg, November 26 – November 27, 1944. After maintaining defensive positions it took part in clearing the Colmar Pocket, 23 January 18 February 1945, and on 15 March struck against Siegfried Line positions south of Zweibrucken.

**26 Mar 45:** The Division smashed through the defenses and crossed the Rhine, then drove on to take Nuremberg in a fierce battle, capturing the city in block-by-block fighting, 17-20 April.

**27-30 Apr 45:** The Division pushed on to take Augsburg and Munich, 27-30 April, and was in the vicinity of Salzburg when the war in Europe ended—and in fact though the 3rd had captured Berchtesgaden before being relieved by the 101st. (See April 2001 *Watch*.)

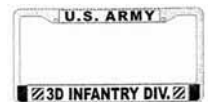
